Dear Mr. Potts:

You requested the baseline specifications for the above referenced vessel which is eligible for the following limited access permits: Northeast (NE) multispecies, monkfish, summer flounder, scup, black sea bass, longfin squid, butterfly, Atlantic mackerel (Tier 3), American lobster, and Limited Access General Category (LAGC-IFQ) scallop.

The current regulations for limited access American lobster and LAGC scallop permits do not require the establishment of a vessel baseline, which means there are no size or horsepower limitations for these permits. For an American lobster and LAGC scallop vessel to be replaced by a vessel that is larger than allowed under the replacement provisions, other limited access permits must be permanently relinquished in writing.

On August 26, 2015, new regulations became effective that eliminated the one-time upgrade provision and the gross and net tonnage baseline specifications. This means that as of August 26, 2015, the baseline specifications now only consist of length overall (LOA) and horsepower. Also, you will now be able to do a vessel replacement up to your full 10 percent in length and 20 percent for horsepower. The once a year vessel replacement provision, however still stands. This means if you do a vessel replacement in fishing year 2019 then you may not do another vessel replacement until the following 2020 fishing year. Your baseline information is provided below.

This vessel's baseline for the above listed permits was established on the F/V *Lady Patricia*, (formerly named *Irene Maria*, *Benfica*, *See No Evil*, and *Lutador II*), Permit # 330200, O.N. 581831.

Based on NOAA's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) historical records and all vessel documentation the owner has submitted to NMFS, the baseline specifications for the permits currently on the F/V *Lady Patricia* are:

LENGTH OVERALL (LOA):	75.3'
ENGINE HORSEPOWER (HP):	565

The maximum allowable upgrades for the permits currently on the F/V *Lady Patricia* are:

MAXIMUM LENGTH OVERALL:	83'
MAXIMUM HORSEPOWER:	678



In the event of a fraction, it is our policy to round up the calculated maximum allowable upgrade to the next whole number. Therefore, all maximum values calculated for this letter have been rounded up to the next whole number.

This letter is intended only as a summary of this vessel's permit information as of this date. Further, the information provided above does not reflect agreements of which NMFS has no knowledge regarding any reservation of permit rights by the current or previous owners upon sale of the vessel. Nor does this letter guarantee that these permits can be renewed or applied for in the future. This information is advisory only. We reserve the right to make final determinations regarding this vessel's eligibility for any permit.

Limited Access General Category (LAGC) Fishing Year 2019 Individual Fishing Quota (IFQ)

Dear LADY PATRICIA INC,

Under the proposed Framework 30 specifications for the LAGC IFQ fishery, the initial 2019 allocation for F/V LADY PATRICIA (Permit #330200) is **0.3733%** of the 2,998,287 lb total catch allocated to vessels issued a limited access general category IFQ scallop permit. Therefore, beginning April 1, 2019 your proposed vessel's initial scallop IFQ will be **11,200 lb**.

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Important Fishing and Transfer Information

- The IFQ allocation listed above does not include any IFQ carry-over or deductions for IFQ overages in fishing year 2018. These adjustments, if applicable, will be provided to you after the end of fishing year 2018.

Additional information about managing your vessel's IFQ pounds

- You **cannot** land more scallops than you've been allocated. This means that you **cannot** fish for, possess, or land scallop IFQ if you do not have quota available.
- If you don't have enough available quota to cover an upcoming trip and you've submitted a lease or transfer of IFQ to us, **you must wait** until we have approved your lease/transfer before that quota can be fished.
- You are responsible for monitoring your available pounds and the amount of scallops harvested during the year. If you have a negative IFQ balance or you exceed your yearly IFQ allocation, you cannot fish for scallops until you either temporarily (lease) or permanently transfer in IFQ to balance an overage. While you can balance an overage within a fishing year through temporary IFQ leases and/or permanent allocation transfers, **it is still a violation of the IFQ regulations to have had a negative balance.**



Longfin Squid Moratorium Permit Requalification

You have re-qualified to retain your limited access longfin moratorium (formerly longfin/butterfish or SMB 1) permit for the **F/V LADY PATRICIA** (Permit 330200). We have enclosed an updated 2018 fishing year permit for your vessel that includes the new Tier 1 longfin squid moratorium permit (SMB 1A, MRI: 58622) and new separate butterfish moratorium permit (SMB 6, MRI: 33184). These permits are effective on March 1, 2019.

To qualify for a Tier 1 permit, a vessel must have landed at least 10,000 lb of longfin squid in any year from 1997-2013. We determined that you qualified for this permit based on our records and the information you submitted. **Best Year: 2000, Pounds Landed: 153,345.**

You will find more information about the longfin squid and butterfish possession limits in the bulletin sent to you on December 13, 2018. Please contact the Sustainable Fisheries Division at (978) 281-9315 for more information.

Reminder: Limited access permits must be renewed annually. Applications for limited access permits must be received at least 30 days before the last day of the permit year. If you do not renew your limited access permit annually, you will not be able to get it back.

Dear Limited Access Northeast Multispecies Permit Holder:

This letter explains your updated potential sector contribution (PSC) and your days-at-sea (DAS) allocation and provides an estimate of the pounds your permit would contribute to a sector for fishing year 2019.

A PSC is the share of a stock's quota that a permit may contribute to a sector. A PSC is equal to a permit's percentage of the total commercial landings during 1996-2006 (or 1996-2001 for Georges Bank cod for some vessels). Sectors must submit their final sector rosters to us by March 8, 2019; however, sectors may set a more restrictive deadline for sector enrollment.

Table 1 shows the fishing year 2019 PSCs for your **Permit #330200, Moratorium Right ID #750**. **Table 2** shows your expected base DAS allocation for fishing year 2019. Any changes to your PSCs between years result from corrections made to the dealer and vessel landings history data used to calculate PSCs, as well as the redistribution of PSCs associated with cancelled permits. Table 1 also includes an estimate of the pounds your permit would contribute to a sector's annual catch entitlements (ACE) in fishing year 2019. We calculated the estimate of pounds by multiplying your fishing year 2019 PSC by the expected fishing year 2019 commercial groundfish annual catch limit (ACL) for each stock. For most stocks, the fishing year 2019 ACLs in this letter are those adopted in Northeast Multispecies Fishery Management Plan Framework Adjustment 57. For the remaining stocks, this letter includes the proposed fishing year 2019 ACLs currently under consideration in Framework 58. These ACLs and ACEs are not final, and may change. Due to a total ACL overage for Gulf of Maine cod from fishing year 2017, the commercial groundfish allocation will be reduced in 2019. This reduction will affect the allocation to both sectors and the common pool, and is reflected in this letter.
